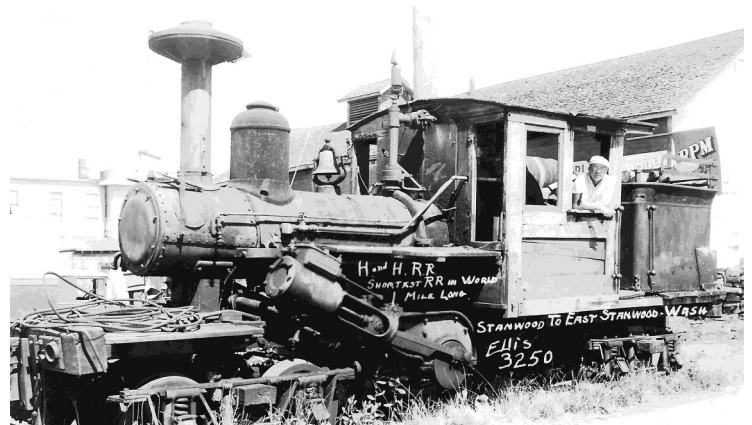
The H & H Railroad "Climax" locomotive engine in the photograph above was the last engine used on the one mile route between the Stanwood mills on the waterfront and the Great Northern railroad. The railroad was established in 1904 by John W. Hall. It carried passengers in an old streetcar in the early years but in later years the old Climax locomotive carried wood products to the depot in East Stanwood. It was known as the shortest railroad in the "world" and called the "dinky" by locals. The line was one mile from the

Stanwood waterfront to the depot connection.

The man in the window in the photograph on the front is Jesse N. Hall (1892-1955). His son was also named Jesse. Jesse N's father, John W. Hall (1870-1931) came from Kansas and found his way to Stanwood where he was first a teamster for Robert Bates. Hall later established the Stanwood Feed & Livery at the corner of Main and Saratoga Street (near Bob's Market & Deli.) The livery wagon carried mail and passengers to and from the Great Northern Railroad connection. The photograph shows the bell that is in our museum collection that was on the Climax engine.

The wonderful early snapshot photograph above was taken in October 1922 of the famed cedar stump now at the Smokey Point/Arlington Rest Stop on I-5. This stump was first noted in 1911 as a popular spot near "Island Crossing" (north of Smokey Point/Arlington rest stop). It was moved more than once along the Pacific Highway. 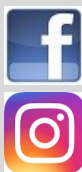

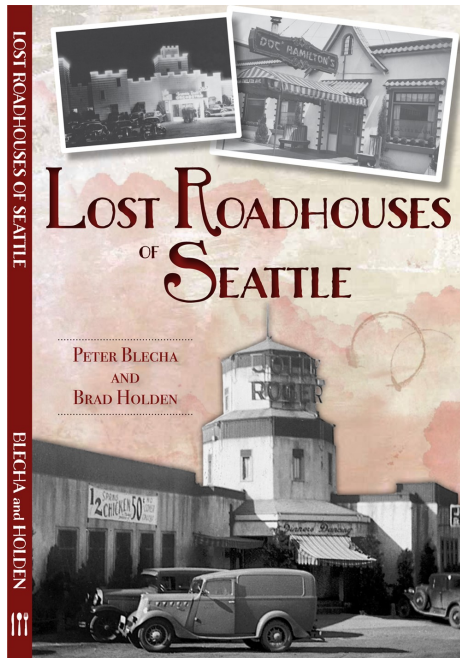

Hourly pay is \$17.00 and include both weekend, weekday and occasional evening shifts as needed. Training will be provided for someone interested in occasional work.

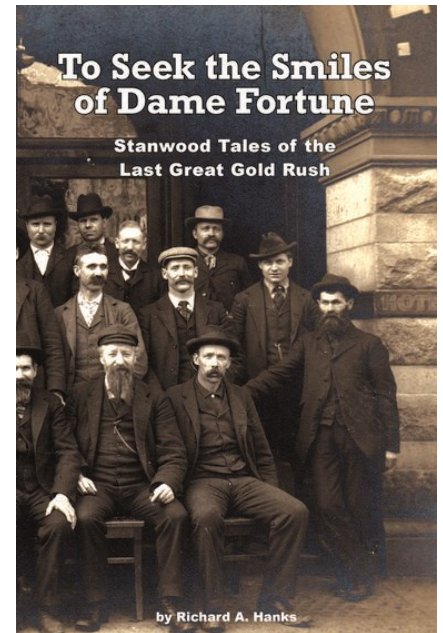

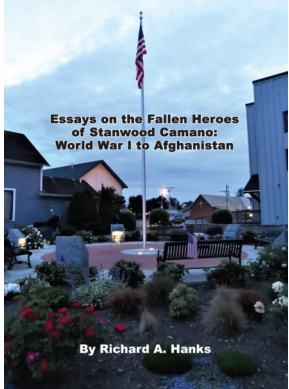
To Seek the Smiles of Dame Fortune

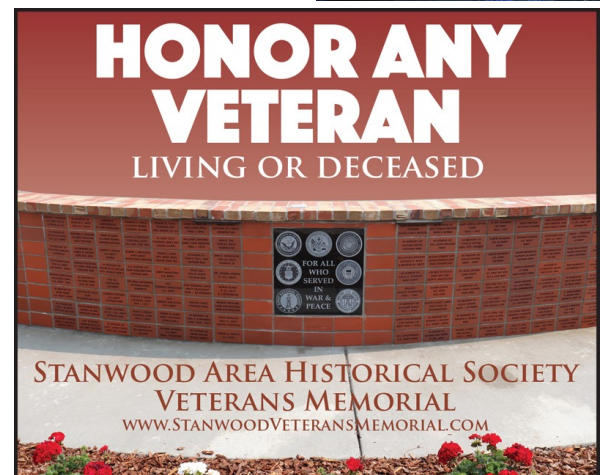

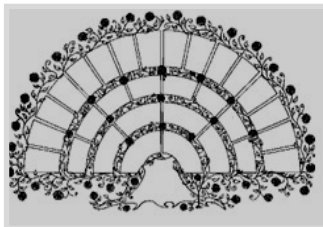
