#### Viking Village Era, East Stanwood



Over sixty years ago in February 1964 it was announced that John Strandjord and George Hanson had purchased the 18 acres farmland owned by Francis Giard, East Stanwood's first mayor and a Klondiker. The former mayor's beautiful home with its distinctive tower was demolished in July 1964 to make way for a new shopping center. George Hanson had operated the Pure Foods Mart since 1946 in a building that once was the Bartz Hotel (near the railroad tracks.) John Strandjord was a real estate developer. Meanwhile, S.R. 532 (then Hwy I-Y) was being

constructed bypassing the main street through town. By February site preparation and fill work had already begun. "The lush pasture was now blacktopped with parking for 150 cars."

Above is an aerial view from above Stanwood looking East before the construction of State Route 532 (first called Highway I-Y). The Giard farm fields had channels for draining into Irvine Slough tributary to the Stillaguamish River. This was critical drainage for the Giard Farm and East Stanwood. S. R. 532 was built upon a levee in 1960-61. In this view the sewage lagoon is not yet in place. In the far right is the Hamilton Lumber company stack.

In December 1962 the new section of Highway I-Y from the west end of town to Lindstrom Road was

completed. The new highway approach to Stanwood allowed for more convenient access to a new shopping center and expansion of other businesses and services.

Plans for the new Viking Village Shopping Center appeared in a March 26, 1964 Stanwood News issue featuring a proposed 7,000 square foot grocery. It had a unique steeply angled roofline in the center with side wings, wooden beams and stonework. At the peak of the roofline was a dragon-like figure mounted as if on the prow of a ship. The Stanwood News reported the carver

was Andy Fleshman of Mount Vernon. This original carving has long since deteriorated but was replaced by a new carving in the early 2010s. The 2024 photograph (opposite) shows it looking a bit weathered but intact. There are now plans to replace these buildings with a new housing development that will have some retail space.



In 1981 after managing Thrifty Foods since 1964, Bob Andrews became manager of the Viking Market. It was also managed by his son, also named Bob Andrews. The Viking Village Shopping Center has lasted about 60 years. It is thought to be quaint when compared with the ultra modern new shopping centers with far greater square footage. It was accessible to visitors on their way to Camano Island as its population began to grow. We await another era for this property currently being planned.



In 1967, the Fjord Room opened in the Viking Restaurant "where you could enjoy a night out dining and dancing!" (1999.138.1969\_01\_18)



#### Alger Bay Baseball Team circa 1914

This digital photo of a 1914 postcard shows players representing Alger Bay according to Bonnie Duncan Peters who provided the scan to the Historical Society in 2008. Since then we haven't uncovered any more details about the team or the place before this except as it is known now with scattered school records and vague land records. The Alger Bay school was located across from the South Camano Grange which was established later in 1930. The name was on early U.S. Coast and Geodetic Survey charts and early school records it was the U.S Board of Geographic Names settled on Elger Bay with an "E" in 1895 according to Richard Blumental, author of
